#### PASTOR'S PONDERINGS...

Dear Church,

Of course March arrived in a gale with floods and ice and snow! Not only is the month supposed to roar in like a lion, but we are walking through the most challenging season of the church year, Lent.

And listening to the winds that buffeted my office I remembered that we often speak of how the wind of the Holy Spirit often blows us through our faith journeys in ways we do not anticipate.

This all reminded me of ideas offered in past PC(USA) General Assembly Moderator, Joan Gray's book, Sailboat Church: Helping Your Church Rethink Its Mission and Practice. She believes that given the deep losses most congregations have experienced over the last forty or so years – loss of members, especially children, a society that no longer seems to value church membership and such – churches need to be asking a very important question:

Since it seems we are no longer church the way we've always been church... then what does God want us to be and do now?

There are at least two ways to approach that question. Most people think that church depends mostly on human effort. You know, God has given us a basic agenda and then it's up to us to make it happen. We are in charge of getting the job loving God and loving one another done. "Just do it" so to speak.

So they act as if everything depends on their own strength, wisdom and resources. Being a successful, comfortable church depends on our good works and good decisions about programs and the like. In this way, church life is like life in a rowboat. As you row, you're always looking backwards to make sure you have stayed true to the idea of church. And you notice that don't make progress unless you're willing to row long and hard... and fast.

But there's another option to consider. In his letter to the Ephesians, Paul wrote, "God can do more than we can ask or imagine." For those who keep this in mind church becomes a continuing adventure of looking ahead in partnership with a God who guides and empowers them to do more than they could ever have dreamed. They realize that the Holy Spirit is blowing them to a new place where they may need to live as church a bit differently than they always had.

These people live life as if on a sailboat. And if you've ever sailed or talked with a sailor you know that navigating the boat is an ongoing process of discernment that takes time and energy. The winds may change. A storm may come up.

Sailors know that the progress of their journey isn't solely in their hands. Yes, sailing is still hard work. Sailors must always look ahead and use their skills and abilities to hoist the sails and "come to." But they also understand that progress really depends on the breeze.

A church that lives on a sailboat knows the journey doesn't depend on just their skills. It depends on the wind of the Holy Spirit. After all, without God they can do nothing (John 15:5) and with God all things are possible (Luke 1:37).

So where does this leave us, the First Presbyterian Church of Huron?

Well, it seems as though we are becoming a sailboat church. You see, at their last meeting the Session began considering how the congregation can be as faithful as possible to God's desire for us as church in *this time and place*.

This information will help create a current and more complete picture of where we are so we can better navigate to the place God's Spirit is leading us. That picture will begin to take shape when the Session reviews the lists and starts considering in what ways the church is strongest now and where there are opportunities for realistic growth, etc.

Friends, we are hoisting the sails and untying our sailboat from the dock. In the coming months (perhaps even years) we will discern where the Spirit is moving and inviting us to invest ourselves in God's work. Sometimes this journey will be as challenging as the season of Lent. Yet as we sail ahead, our understanding of God's hopes and dreams for this church will unfurl with the Spirit's energizing breeze!



#### Thursday, March 29th


Our Maundy Thursday Tenebrae Service will be held on Thursday, March 29th @ 7 pm in our sanctuary.

#### Have you ever....

taught a child to fold their fingers inside their hands and say the rhyme, "here is the church, here is the steeple, open the doors and see all the people?" The wiggling fingers teach children, and adults, too, that the church is not the building — the steeples, windows, or structure, but people gathering to worship God.

There's something else in the children's rhyme. As the child breaks open their hands to reveal the people," they move their fingers back and forth, often as fast as they can. This simple move reminds us that the church is the energy and actions that share the love of Christ.

When injustice falls on those who are vulnerable and people join hands with one another and lift their voices against the interests of power, *this is church*.


