Dear Church,

With Little Wonders on summer vacation, it's gotten very quiet around here.

That doesn't mean there's nothing going on – au contraire!

A **Prayer Group** meets the first and third Monday at 1:00... And <u>you are welcome</u> to drop in and pray with them.

Christ's Meals are the <u>first and third Wednesdays at 5:00</u>... The team prepares quite a feast! And a wonderful group of neighbors share conversation and smiles over their meals. Ginny Parisi and the Pullanos and a few others have been known to come and eat with us... You might enjoy dining out at church those nights too. (And instead of paying for your meal you can always help clean off tables!)

The **Growth and Preservation** team is looking into <u>supporting several different outreach</u> <u>opportunities</u>. Hopefully there'll be more news on that front by July!

Christian Ed is super busy getting ready for the **shared VBS program 9:00-11:30 a.m. July 9-13**. VBS will be at the Methodist Church this year and here next summer. They <u>still need people to help</u> with various tasks so call Cindy Kaman if you'd like to help!

They've also been working on a <u>child protection policy</u> that includes <u>background checks for all volunteers</u> <u>who work with children and youth</u> here at church. These simple checks (NO fingerprinting!) are cost effective AND allow parents to know that their child is safe with anyone we authorize as caregivers/teachers etc.

Finance and Maintenance is working on <u>repairing the pillars by the doors</u> into the parlor from the parking lot. They're also looking into some other important items for the good of the building and those who come here.

Session leaders are <u>beginning to work on the church operations manual</u> that will be the resource for all the little details that you can think of – from job descriptions and insurance policies to bylaws and ethical conduct policies and so much more!

Other **Session leaders** are considering how we <u>view the stewardship of and in the church</u> and asking the question of how we reflect the spirit of generosity and gratitude as people of faith.

The **Worship Committee** has decided to <u>forego liturgists</u> this summer – except for Communion Sundays: <u>June 3, July 1, August 8 and September 9</u>. They've also been working to <u>simplify summer worship ser</u>vices a bit while still keeping them fully Reformed in look and feel.

As for me, I'm trying to keep up with every one of them... as well as looking into a couple of new initiatives for the church and for the greater Huron community.

- After several conversations the staff Becky, Jann, Judy, Chris Hakeman and I have decided to take a **CPR course** that's offered by the Huron Fire Department. Cindy Kaman, Janet Mueller and Ann Pullano are also joining us for this event at 1:00 Wednesday, June 13. <u>If you'd like to join us</u>, please let Becky or me know. You're most welcome!
- The CPR seminar comes after Judy, Jann, Becky, Kim, Amber and I took a one hour course with Huron Police Officer Keith Lobsinger on ALICE a strategic way to handle active shooter emergency. His lesson was quite sobering but truly worthwhile! We appreciate his work!
- I am most excited that **four** of the church's **young people** <u>will be exploring their faith throughout the summer with me</u>. We'll share in a couple of classes and a few independent learning opportunities. At the conclusion of this journey they will be invited to profess their faith publically and become adult members of the church.
- And of course I'll be <u>helping with VBS</u>, getting to know Huron by <u>serving as a parking attendant</u> for some of the events that use the church lot and roaming through the festivals getting acquainted with the towns people!

So Little Wonders is on vacation... And we may remember the lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer as a time to kick back and relax...

But it looks like this church will continue to be a beacon of active hope in this terrific lakeside community!

You are invited to prayerfully consider making a gift separate from your pledge in support of this special fund. Make sure you note the purpose of your contribution in the memo line of your check.



SUMMER WORSHIP NEWS






She will be attending the Univ. of Cincinnati Majoring in Child Psychology.
