#### LET'S WELCOME A DEW PREACHING STUDENT TO THE PULPIT!

This congregation has a long history of opening their hearts and minds to men and women who have felt God's call to become a pastor. Janeane Hopkins and Tim Whalen are two of the more recent ministerial students who have learned about their call here in this place. So when the presbytery asked me if Huron First would like to guide a preaching student through four sermons, I took the idea to Session. After some consideration, they chose to participate in the effort.

That's how it came to be that this Sunday, November 4, Elder Edward Bettendorf will preach his first sermon in the Huron First pulpit.

Edward is a life-long Presbyterian. Raised in Fairview Park, Ohio he attended Yale University before joining the U S Army in the 1970's. After separation he pursued a law degree and soon began practice as a trial law-yer with ATT in the Cleveland area. For 23 years he and his wife, Marta Vielhaber, lived in Mayfield Heights and attended the Western Reserve Church in Pepper Pike where he served on Session. After 32 years with ATT he and Marta, who was a pediatrician and allergist both retired from practice and came to live at their cottage in Lakeside. They've joined the Firelands Presbyterian Church there and Ed serves on the Worship and Music and Safety and Security Committees and is their Clerk of Session. While not fulfilling his church duties, Ed enjoys holidays in Arizona, piloting his airplane and walking the couple's two large dogs. Their daughter, Genevieve, is currently working towards a PhD in English at the City College of New York.

Ed will preach for us four times between November and early May. Pastor Deb will serve as Liturgist each time and a small group of observers will evaluate Ed's sermons and give regular feedback. When the program is completed he will be fully prepared to serve as "Pulpit Supply" preacher for churches when their regular pastor is on vacation.

### Worship Wonderings



Autumn is a time when we notice the darkening of the earth and begin to settle in for the winter ahead. And the end of October brings All Hallows' Eve, a "thin" time when our Celtic forbearer's poignantly sensed the ebb and flow of the boundaries between this world and the next.

All in all, it's a time when we often feel a deep calling to our hearts inviting us to more deeply contemplate the mysteries and sacredness of life. It's then we find ourselves seeking inward signs of God's grace, something not ordinarily seen. So we find ourselves developing new or welcoming old rituals in our lives. Often these rituals signify holy mysteries which have been handed down to us from generation to generation. They become sacred and through their practice we grow closer to God.

It has been said that such sacraments are occasions when something holy happens. They become transparent moments when people can see through the veil of time to something deep inside time.

On Sunday November 4 we will have the joy of sharing in at least two moments when holiness happens by celebrating both Reformed sacraments during worship. Early on in the service we'll rejoice with the Williamson family as they bring their second grandchild, Nora Jane Hoover, to be baptized. Later in our time together we'll share in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Both rituals signify holy mysteries and like generations before us, draw us into the depths of God's presence!

But November 4<sup>th</sup> is also All Saints Sunday. So the joys of the day will be tempered by the time during which we'll remember the saints of this congregation who have, over the last twelve or so months, left this earth to join the "Church Triumphant."



Oh that phrase! Being parted from a love one through death feels anything but triumphant. And yet when we remember that through our baptism we have been united with Christ, and through our savoring of the holy meal we are strengthened for our earthly journey until we are brought home to him... Well then perhaps we can glimpse the eternal joy that our loved ones are experiencing and that waits for us all when we pass on to new life. Perhaps through remembering them God will draw us closer to God's heart.

Officially, Presbyterians recognize just two sacraments. But I believe that on this first Sunday of November our entire service will be sacramental, a time of transparency when we will taste and "see what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God" and poignantly sense God's wondrous grace.

And those worshipful moments together will be joyfully holy!

# Why do I Need to Return a Pledge Card?

# A BEAUTIFUL FALL FALCON

At first, he thought it was a Red-tailed Hawk. But he took some telephoto shots of the bird and discovered that the raptor was a rare Peregrine Falcon, probably in migration. It had crossed Lake Erie, and was perched and preening on our steeple, a welcome place of rest after its long migration flight.

In Israel, eagles and falcons migrate along the ridges of hills. Consequently, there are many scriptural references to these regal birds. For instance, in Job 39:26 God says to Job: "Is it by your understanding that the hawk soars, stretching his wings toward the south? This church was blessed to be a rest stop for one such bird flying south!


