Pastor's Ponderings...

Dear Church,

Brilliant October days have been replaced by the impenetrable fogs of late fall. And even once the mists have lifted, we seem to be stranded within a colorless quiet that discourages our hearts. So we tuck ourselves into cozy comforters that allow a temporary respite from the damp chill. "All is safely gathered in, e'er the winter storms begin."


And yet the celebration of Jesus' birth is just a few weeks away. Somehow the gloom of the world around us feels out

of line with the happiness and joy we expect to feel on that day.

Expect. We expect the babe will once more come into our lives and we will no longer experience the pains or sorrows of this earthly life. So we look forward to that time with great hope, which of course makes this time before the celebration rather hard to bear.

Back in the "old days" of church, Christians hid from this season of waiting in hope by singing favorite Christmas carols in worship and sharing Christmas cookies from the first Sunday of December onward.

In more recent years mainline denominations, including Presbyterians, began to intentionally remember the stories, promises and images of the



In those days, from the feast of St. Martin on November 11 to Epiphany on January 6, Western European Christians observed a season of fasting and preparation for baptisms which were regularly held on Epiphany. When Sts. Patrick and Columba shared the good news in Ireland they emphasized the coming of the Lord for judgment during the late fall and early winter.

And in keeping with the theme of penitence, they wore purple vestments to remind worshippers that before Jesus was crucified he accepted being wrapped in purple so as to remind all people that he was willing to take on their sin so they could turn back to God.

Just as we do during Lent, this season of paying attention to "end of world" matters and ancient stories of those who prepared the way of the Lord invites Jesus' followers to look into their hearts and seek ways to mend behaviors that fall short of his teachings. And this quiet, brooding atmosphere that surrounds us now allows us the space in which to do so.

Just as the word Advent means, Jesus is coming. Christ will arrive.

During worship this Advent season we will take time to remember Christ's coming in final victory, how John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord and how Mary and Elizabeth were filled with wonder at the news that God was coming to live on earth with them! We'll also sing hymns like "O Come, O Come, Emanuel," Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates," and" Lo, How A Rose E'er Blooming."

But I want to invite you to take time over the next few weeks to look deeply into the fogs of late fall, to wrap your-selves in soft comforters and consider the meaning of Christ's birth, life, death and resurrection in your life. Prepare your hearts to receive him.

For he is coming. The light of the world is coming! And the brilliance of his love will burn away the fog of our hearts. When our hope arrives we'll feel his encouragement as we serve God. And then we'll sing together with the heavenly choirs "Joy to the World!"

J. Barrie Shepherd Faces at the Manger

Do you want to find Mary's baby boy for the first time – again? Perhaps you've wondered about what the visitors to Jesus' manger felt or thought or even did after they saw the baby?

To help answer those questions, this Advent you're invited to come, hear and discuss excerpts from Rev. J. Barrie Shepherd's Advent classic "Faces at the Manger." In poems, prayers and brief meditations this book describes the thoughts, feelings, questions, and dreams of those who gathered around the newborn king so long ago, as well as the faces that have been there in the centuries since.

Though we'll have a few copies of Rev. Shepherd's book on hand, you need not buy one to participate. Just come as you are to listen as the good pastor's writings

OUT OF CHAOS, HOPE

"The flame shall not consume you"

We know that your hearts, like ours, have been broken as the devastation wrought by wildfires in California continues to increase in severity. In addition to the destruction of land and forests, the cost to lives and human community has been unprecedented, and those costs are still rising. The town of Paradise has been leveled; more than 80 people have been confirmed dead at this writing, and thousands more are unaccounted for. In Northern California, families are living in tents and having difficulty accessing basic services; many of those who have lost their homes are older than 60. While the focus is on those closest to the fires, the impact is widespread. Due

to the smoke, communities hundreds of miles from the fires are being impacted by unhealthy air quality. What's more, after the wildfires there is an increased risk of mudslides.

Through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) has been present since the beginning of the disaster. Working closely with leadership in the affected presbyteries, we have released emergency grants to support the presbyteries in meeting the urgent needs of their neighbors. At the request of the Red Cross, PDA has deployed four disaster spiritual care providers from our national response team to work directly with survivors in shelters and the affected communities. We are deploying additional PDA teams to support the presbyteries in their assessment and response as they help their neighbors begin recovery. Additional grants for ongoing emergency support for survivors and long-term recovery will be forthcoming.




