### Warm Welcome To Our New Organist, Matthew Dion!

First Presbyterian Church is delighted to welcome Matthew Dion as our new regular organist/accompanist! Although he's been seen and heard 'in action' during worship services since September 8<sup>th</sup>, we of the music program thought it would be interesting to provide a bit of information to help us learn more about Matthew as a person. So, with some informal and 'natural' conversations and through a very *fun* interview time with choir members at the end of a rehearsal, a few details emerged which will be highlighted herein. majoring in organ performance. ### "Music Under The Steeple" 2019-2020 Concert Series

### CHURCH WORLD SERVICE: HURRICANE RESPONSE

At the beginning of the month, Hurricane Dorian slammed into the Bahamas with deadly force and left widespread devastation in its wake. Then it made landfall in North Carolina, causing flooding and knocking out power.

Now, Tropical Depression Imelda has brought torrential rain and flooding to parts of Texas that were ravaged by Hurricane Harvey.

The Church World Service is responding in the Bahamas as part of an ACT Alliance Rapid Support Team. Alongside their ACT and other partners, they will focus particularly on long-term recovery.

In the United States, they are shipping CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets, Blankets, Hygiene Kits and School Kits to both Texas and North Carolina and will continue to respond to requests for supplies as part of immediate relief efforts. They are engaging with partners on the ground to help ensure that their most vulnerable neighbors have the care and support they will need to recover over the longer term.
