GOD'S LOVE IS WIDE AND DEEP

"And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God."

--Ephesians 3:17b-19

In 2019, many people reminisced on the 50th anniversary of the lunar landing. Looking up at the sky at night, it still boggles the mind that humanity was able to send people to land and walk upon the surface of the moon, and that they returned safely to us.

If you are a fan of the Netflix drama "The Crown", you may have seen the episode dealing with the British royal family's fascination with the lunar landing, and their invitation to the astronauts to visit with them at Buckingham Palace. The visit from the astronauts is not the main topic of the episode. Instead, the episode primarily deals with Prince Philip's crisis of faith. (Spoiler alert: If you are currently watching "The Crown", please view the episode "Moondust" before continuing with this reading.)

"The Crown" chronicles Philip's difficult childhood. Though he was royalty, his family was exiled. His parents' marriage broke down. His mother spent many years institutionalized. One of his sisters and her family died in a plane crash. His family had members that fought on both sides in World War II. He developed a toughness in his life which did not allow for a loving God.

Not seen in "The Crown" is Easter Sunday, 1964. Queen Elizabeth and Philip's son, Charles, was confirmed in the Anglican Church. He chose for himself to be confirmed in the faith. His father disapproved, saying he was too young to know what he believed. Instead of worshipping that Easter Sunday, Philip spent the service in the pew reading a book, putting on display his lack of interest in faith.

In "The Crown", Philip is beyond thrilled for his opportunity to meet the astronauts. He assumes that they are going to have deep philosophical insights into their space exploration. When he meets them, he is underwhelmed. They are ordinary people who did something extraordinary. Philip must grapple with the fact that although science and philosophy can and do give insight and meaning to life, they cannot fully feed the soul.

Philip does eventually find his way back to God, with the help of an Anglican Priest who invites him to explore faith with clergy who are burned out. Philip helps to raise funds for a retreat center on the grounds of Windsor, and even dialogues with clergy who are on retreat. Through these discussions, Philip begins to understand "how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ."

Lent begins on Wednesday, February 26th. That evening we will have a short worship service at 6:30 p.m. This

will begin the 40 day journey to Easter. Beginning on February 25th, we will begin a study called *The God We Can Know*. It's an examination of Jesus' "I Am" statements throughout the book of John. You can read more about the study elsewhere in the newsletter, but I want to encourage you to purchase the book and follow along whether or not you are able to come to our weekly study. Maybe you are like Philip, in need of a kick-start to your faith. Or maybe you really need to search the depths of Christ's love for you. Maybe you just want to enjoy the fellowship and discussion. Whatever the reason, my prayer is that we will all come to know more "how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ."




LENTEN SUPPER/STUDY

PER CAPITA: WHAT IS IT?

There are 10,000 Presbyterian Church USA congregations in the United States, and we are all connected to one another through our Presbytery, Synods, and General Assembly. For over 150 years, the Presbyterian Church has used the Per Capita funding system to pay for the operating costs of the wider church. When we pay Per Capita, we are paying for all of the administrative and ecclesiastical systems in our denomination. Per Capita enables churches to call pastors; supports those pastors in their ministries; provides for guidance in troubled times; encourages those called to church leadership; and enables us to gather as the body of Christ. This year's Per Capita is \$35.70 per member. \$8.95 goes to the Office of the General Assembly. \$3.25 goes to the Synod of the Covenant. \$23.70 goes to the Maumee Valley Presbytery. Our congregation is bound to pay \$35.70 per member of our church. Although Per Capita is included as a line item in the budget, you can help offset the costs of Per Capita. Please consider contributing \$35.70. In doing so, you are helping our denomination continue its important ministries.

March for Meals

March is designated as a nationwide celebration for Meals on Wheels. Named "March for Meals", communities across the country are asked to support a program that allows seniors to live healthy, happy and independent lives at home, where they want to be. In Erie County, alone, over 71,000 meals were delivered to

clients during 2019. While we all celebrate the increase in lifespan, maintaining health while aging comes with a price. Without support from programs like Meals on Wheels, millions of seniors are forced to prematurely trade their homes for nursing facilities. It costs less to provide a senior with Meals on Wheels for an entire year than it costs to spend one day in the hospital or six days in a nursing home. Meals on Wheels has been guided by a single goal since the first known U.S. delivery by a small group of Philadelphia citizens in 1954 – to support our senior neighbors to extend their independence and health as they age. What started as a compassionate idea has grown into one of the largest and most effective social movements in America, currently helping nearly 2.4 million seniors annually in virtually every community in the country. In addition, the




