### LOVE IN THE TIME OF THE CORONAVIRUS

The Diamond Princess luxury ship was scheduled to be on a 14 day tour of Asian countries. The departure date was January 20th in Tokyo. The ship left port on that day. One passenger departed the ship in Hong Kong on January 25th. On February 1st, that same passenger was diagnosed with the coronavirus. Public health officials quickly moved to quarantine everyone on the ship to their rooms. Some passengers have been repatriated to their countries, but even with the quarantine, 621 people have been diagnosed with coronavirus. There were over 2000 passengers on the ship, and over 1,000 members of the crew.

We are plenty familiar with the news of the coronavirus by now. As I type, there have been 75,305 coronavirus cases confirmed. Of those, 2,012 people have died, while 15,126 people have recovered. In the United States, only 15 cases have been confirmed, while three of those people have fully recovered.

It's a different story in China. There have been 74,188 total cases of coronavirus in China, with 2,006 total deaths. Imagine the fear, heartache, and grief in China. Imagine trying to witness to the glory of God in the midst of this type of suffering and uncertainty.

Listen to these words from an anonymous Wuhan pastor, from an open letter to clergy worldwide: "Wuhan's pestilence cannot separate us from the love of Christ; this love is in our Lord Jesus Christ."

The same pastor asks us to pray for the Chinese people, adding, "If you do not feel a responsibility to pray, ask the Lord for a loving soul, an earnestly prayerful heart; if you are not crying, ask the Lord for tears. Because we surely know that only through the hope of the Lord's mercy will this city be saved."

We need to pray for the people of China, and throughout Asia where the coronavirus has really had a huge impact. We can also help our brothers and sisters in Asia through the Presbyterian Outreach Foundation. Already, they have had a hand in delivering more than ten thousand medical protective screens, 250,000 pairs of medical examination gloves, close to 50,000 masks, and hundreds of tons of disinfectants. 




### BOY SCOUT SPAGHETTI DINNER








### LITTLE WONDERS


