Message from your Pastor

"Creation, Curse, and Repentance"

Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 17th. Lent is our period of preparation for the death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. During the season of Lent, Christians are encouraged to walk with Jesus in remembrance of his suffering and sacrifice. It is a time of humility and sacrifice for Christians. Ash Wednesday itself usually involves the imposition of ashes on the believer's forehead as a reminder of one's own mortality. The day itself focuses on three themes: creation, curse, and repentance. There are three Scriptures to consider these themes.

- Creation, Genesis 2:7: Then the Lord God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being. The Creator of all the universe formed human beings. Our very creation is dependent upon God, Who willed us into being.
- Curse, Genesis 3:19: By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return. In our sinfulness, human beings turned our backs on the fellowship and sustenance God offered. We wanted to be independent from Him, and so God gave us that independence. Unfortunately, that also meant death. Even as we are formed from dust, we return to the dust.
- Repentance, Psalm 51:7-10: Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow. Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones you have crushed rejoice. Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquity. Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. The curse isn't the end of the story. We can repent and turn again to the God who will renew our hearts and cleanse us from sin.

We will observe Ash Wednesday a little differently this year. Instead of one worship service, I will be present in the sanctuary between 11:00 a.m. and noon, and again between 6:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. I will be available to impose ashes and pray during those times, drop-in style. I hope you will be able to join me in this time of preparation for Lent.

The children have been busy in January making snow experiments with lemons. They even "went to the moon" to eat the astronauts' food!







A Message from the Worship Committee:

Worship Guidelines

The Worship Committee would like to thank everyone for their patience during this time of Coronavirus. We know that all of the arrangements for masks and social distancing are a burden, and we appreciate everyone's willingness to do what needs to be done to continue in-person worship.

Recently, at one of our services, the question was raised as to why we must remain seated when singing. It is a good question, and it feels counterintuitive to sit while singing the great hymns of the faith. We hope to explain this decision the committee made and session approved. Singing is one of the riskier Covid transmission behaviors. You may remember that at the start of the pandemic, musicians were especially hit hard. This is because when we are standing and singing, our diaphragms push air out more forcefully than when we are simply talking. However, if we remain seated, the air is not pushed out as forcefully.

Oberlin College asked that we submit our worship guidelines in order to permit our organist to continue working with us. Because we remain masked and seated while singing, and because we limit the amount of time in the sanctuary, he is allowed to continue working with us. They were very skeptical about him returning to us at all, but having stronger guidelines moved the needle.

Every congregation has its own Covid guidelines. Some churches have suspended worship altogether. Some churches don't wear masks and stand to sing. Some churches don't sing, and have no music at all. Each situation is different. The guidelines we have were prayerfully considered by our Session, and we believe them to be, at this time, the most appropriate for our setting.

We thank you for your understanding, and look forward to the day when we can finally remove our masks, stand and sing, and incorporate all the elements of worship in our services.
