





First Presbyterian is Blessed

For most of its history, our Church has been blessed with a kind, joyful and very generous congregation. We have had many stewards within our Church congregation who have maintained, not just the physical structure, but the resources within and that of the congregation itself to provide for the community at large, on God's behalf. Many took it upon themselves as part of their commitment to God and Church and others were given the task to rally the whole to action.

Good Stewardship

Stewardship is "an ethic that embodies the responsible planning and management of resources". When stewardship first appeared in English during the Middle Ages, it functioned as a job description, denoting the office of a steward, or manager of a large household. (I think of medieval times and the hard -nosed kitchen manager telling the cook the foul better be tender and not wasted - or it's off with his head!) Over the centuries, its range of reference spread to the oversight of law courts, employee unions, college dining halls, Masonic lodges, etc., and can be applied to the environment and nature, economics, health, property, information, theology, cultural resources and beyond.

"So Joseph found favor in his sight and attended him, and he made him overseer of his house and put him in charge of all that he had." (Gen. 39:4)

In recent years, the long-established "management" sense of stewardship has evolved a positive meaning, "careful and responsible management". This sense is commonly found in contexts such as "stewardship of the environment, the family business," etc. It also is used as an adjective in phrases such as "stewardship fundraising". But not just in the financial sense. It is meant as fundraising aimed at building good relationships with donors in order to keep them loyal, and is generally recognized as "the acceptance or assignment of responsibility to shepherd and safeguard the valuables of others". Sustainability is another offshoot of stewardship and is the capacity to endure in a relatively ongoing way across various domains of life.

In biblical terms, stewardship is stated as "Utilizing and managing all resources God provides for the glory of God and the betterment of His creation." Christian Stewardship regards the obligation of Christians in managing and utilizing intelligently the gifts that God has given. The Christian steward is not only responsible for the financial blessings provided by God but also the spiritual gifts that are given through the Holy Spirit. God wants human beings to be His stewards in the work of creation, redemption, and sanctification."

Importance of Stewardship



According to scripture, God created Earth for mankind and we are now stewards of His creation. We have a responsibility to look after and take care of this world He has given us – whether in our own worlds/lives, or assisting others in theirs. Our stewardship of creation involves the caretaking of the environment and animals as well as our families and communities. Being a good steward in this world is one way of expressing our love for God and our gratitude to Him.

So what does that mean to First Presbyterian?

As this year's Stewardship Chairman, I want work with you all on the Stewardship campaign launching in September toward making it a sustainable program. One of building strong relationships, finding financial, physical, emotional, and spiritual ways of developing our Stewardship program that will last all year, each year, and be sustainable as we shepherd and safeguard the valuable resources of our Church and those provided by our congregation in God's name. And with the partnership of Session, its committees, and yourselves, work together to funnel those resources into the areas of most need within our church community, and our community at-large.

"As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." (Peter 4:10) That includes a program to grow our membership through that same relationship building, that each and every one of our members can assist with by talking about what we are doing in our Church now, and have done, in the many years of its existence.

We have such a rich story history at First Presbyterian. Leading with the almost 30 years of continuous community meal service with Christ's community meal program. That is a huge feat within itself and, just as the City has recognized the program, so should we recognize that it's sustainability has been due to leadership of our congregation members. Leadership goes hand-in-hand with stewardship and those that have been involved have provided that. It speaks to our ongoing pre-school program, a well-attended vacation bible school, and a generous congregation that has provided us funds for maintaining and managing so many of our much-needed projects on the physical church.

Sustainability is the capacity to endure in a relatively ongoing way across various domains of life. Sustainability is what we have in these programs, and what we aim for in both developing the membership as well as in our Stewardship program. Ensuring continuity as leadership and generations pass down the honor of this service to others within our midst - going hand in hand as life-affirming stewardship of God's gifts to us that we are charged with maintaining. We need that generational continuity to sustain these programs into the future. As witnessed since I started attending First Pres, I hope this most supportive of congregations, will join me in working toward an ongoing program that assist God's work in providing for us into our promising future.

"Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (Corinthians 9:6-7)


