## A Message from Your Pastor

It was not yet the afternoon of Halloween as I wandered through the aisles at Discount Drug Mart when I noticed the "seasonal" area had changed from Jack-O-Lanterns to Santa Claus. It seemed so premature—all the red and green, all the tinsel and stockings, all the Christmas trees out on the shelves. "Sheesh! Give us a chance to get through October and November!"

Maybe I was being a bit of a Scrooge, but as I was driving home I heard my first Christmas song on the radio. "Too soon!" I said to myself. "We haven't even had time for our first pumpkin spice latte, and they already want me to drink the peppermint!" And then I saw the barrage of Advent calendars being advertised at Aldi, at Meijer, at Costco. The Advent calendars I used to have as a kid were very simple. You'd open a cardboard window or door on a house or other building, and there would be a picture of something of Christmas behind it--a tree, a cookie, a manger. These modern day Advent calendars are stuffed full of cheese, or wine, or beer, or dog or cat treats, or Lego figures. "Humbug!" I thought. "They've taken a symbol of patience and turned it into self-indulgence."

Then I read an article by Timothy Larson in Christianity Today about how Christians should not be so concerned about Christmas being too secular in our culture. He has a good point. He writes: "...many Christians are worried that Christmas is becoming secular. I think this concern is looking at the holiday backwards. In our culture, Christmas is the least secular time of the entire year—and the Christmas season takes up 10 percent of the year! Our entire culture is geared up during the holiday season to make it easier to talk about Jesus."

All of these early decorations, Christmas songs, peppermint lattes, and Advent calendars can be an entry into conversation about Christ with those around us. This is a time of year when people are particularly open to hearing about the miracle of God becoming incarnate, born in a manger, come to die for us and for our salvation. This is the only time of year you are likely to hear the words "O holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us we pray; Cast out our sin and enter in, be born in us today" over a loudspeaker in a shopping mall.

I still worry about consumerism and a lack of focus on Christ at Christmas. But I also realize now in a new way the opportunities this time of year gives for us not only to worship at his manger like the wise men, but to also run to the village like the shepherds and proclaim Christ's birth.

## Per Capita Giving


