A Message From Your Pastor: Fake News, Good News

We have all become acquainted with the phrase "fake news" over the past few years. When someone uses that phrase, they mean that what you've read in the newspaper, have seen on cable news, or a news website is untrue or inaccurate. Although "fake news" is current terminology, incorrect or erroneous news has been around for ages. Remember the supermarket tabloid "Weekly World News" and their "Batboy" updates?

The fact is that the world has been dishing out fake news for thousands of years:

- In the 13th Century BC, the Egyptian Pharaoh Rameses the Great publicized that he had defeated the Hittites at the Battle of Kadesh, even implying that he killed several in the battle. The truth? The battle was a stalemate.
- In AD 1475, on Easter Sunday in Trento, Italy, a child went missing. A rumor started that the Jews in the village had kidnapped the child, drinking his blood to celebrate Passover. 15 Jews were burned at the stake as a result of this rumor. This story, and ones similar to it, became foundations of European antisemitism.
- In 1844, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, a newspaper reported that drunk Irishmen were stealing Bibles out of public schools, which lead to riots and vandalism of Irish-American churches.

Christians were early victims of "fake news." Some of the rumors floating around the early church were awful. Christians were portrayed as engaging in cannibalism and incest, and other sorts of immorality.

On top of these rumors, there wasn't much writing about the life of Jesus. Stories about him that were inaccurate or incomplete began to spread throughout the Roman Empire. Luke, who was likely the co-worker Paul mentions in some of his epistles, wanted a first-person narrative of the life of Jesus Christ to pass down through generations. Luke wrote his Gospel approximately 30 years after Jesus's ministry. First-hand witnesses were aging; Luke needed to collect these testimonies.

Luke's Gospel is the focus of the Year C lectionary cycle, and so we will be hearing a lot of stories from Luke this year. Luke's Gospel is the longest of the four, and it even has a sequel: Acts. His gospel contains many themes:

- Jesus is the promised Messiah.
- God's kingdom is upside-down; those at the top will soon be at the bottom. Justice and true righteousness are the marks of the Kingdom of God.
- Salvation is for both Jew and Gentile. The circle
 of salvation extends to all people, even those
 considered as outcast (Luke himself was a
 Gentile).
- Jesus will be rejected by his people.

Luke's Gospel has a way of bringing you great joy (Jesus's birth story, the prodigal son). It has a way of making you feel significant discomfort (the rich man and Lazarus, the parable of the shrewd manager). The real news is that we need both in our lives of discipleship. We need to be comforted, and we need to be challenged. Luke does a great job doing both.

I hope you join me in the journey through Luke this year. We will travel with Jesus from Bethlehem to Jerusalem. Along the way, we will learn new ways of being Christ's disciples in hearing this old, old story. That's not fake news. That's Good News.


