A Message From Your Pastor:

It's Never Too Late

You are receiving this newsletter after the first of February, and it's all my fault. February wore soft shoes, and it snuck up behind me. It didn't just tap me on my shoulder. Instead, it grabbed me and shook me! And now, the newsletter is late.

As I was brainstorming topics for this column, I kept thinking about the concept of "being late." I thought of the White Rabbit

in Alice in Wonderland. I thought about how being late to school would often bring detention. I thought about how sometimes if I am engrossed in a good book or movie, I will stay up late to read or watch.

Have you ever been told you are "too late" for something? Maybe an opportunity passed you by because you were too late in responding. For example, if I don't go to the shoe store early in the season, I am too late to find anything to fit my colossal size

anything to fit my colossal size eleven feet.

Sometimes it becomes "too late" when we are dealing with people. For example, if someone continuously hurts you and refuses to change, it becomes "too late" to say "I'm sorry."

In John 11, Jesus is summoned to Bethany, where Mary, Martha, and Lazarus lived. It was an urgent summons, for Lazarus was dying, and quickly. Instead of leaving quickly, Jesus lingered where he was for two more days. Only then did he get to Bethany, where the profoundly grieving sisters greeted him. Unfortunately, he had been too late.

Or had he? You are probably familiar with the story. Jesus had the people open the tomb, and

then he shouted, "Lazarus, come forth!" Lazarus walked away from the grave alive once again. Jesus is not like us. Jesus is always on time, even when we think he isn't.

Paul describes Jesus as coming at the "fullness of time." Jesus came not one second too late, nor one second too soon. His timing was perfect, even as God is perfect. When we look at time from a more fantastic, cosmic perspective, we understand that God is never "too late."

On the other side of the coin, is it ever too late

for us when we fail to put our faith and hearts in our Lord? Is there ever a time when the Lord throws His hands up in the air and says, "Enough of Sara! My patience has run out with her. It's too late."

Psalm 86 says, "For you, O Lord, are good and forgiving, abounding in steadfast love to all who call upon you." Later, the same Psalm reminds us that God is "merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness."



"I'm going into all the world to make disciples of all nations. So I might be a little late for dinner."

In other words, God is patient with us. More patient with us than we are with others. More patient with us than our mothers and grandmothers. More patient with us than we can even imagine.

If you think you've messed up too much, that there is something that God could never forgive you for doing, that it is too late for you, know that it is not. He will never leave us or forsake us (Deut. 31:8). It is never too late for us in God's eyes.



Consider the nature of prayer. When we pray, we express our complete dependence on God. Prayer acknowledges what Jesus said in John 15:5: "You can do nothing without me". When we pray and ask God for help, we are admitting that we are not "competent in ourselves to claim anything as coming from ourselves, but our adequacy is from God" (2 Cor. 3:5). Prayer testifies that we are "poor in spirit" (Matt. 5:3), that we are not strong but weak, and that, as the hymn says, we "need thee every hour." One of the most humble prayers in the world is "Help me, Lord." When we pray, we are saying that God is merciful and mighty, that He is wise and sovereign, and that He knows far better than we do what is best for us.

Announcements

Per Capita: What is it?

There are 10,000 Presbyterian Church USA congregations in the United States, and we are all connected to one another through our Presbytery, Synods, and General Assembly. For over 150 years, the Presbyterian Church has used the Per Capita funding system to pay for the operating costs of the wider church. When we pay Per Capita, we are paying for all of the administrative and ecclesiastical systems in our denomination. Per Capita enables churches to call pastors; supports those pastors in their ministries; provides for guidance in troubled times; encourages those called to church leadership; and enables us to gather as the body of Christ.

This year's Per Capita is \$37.23 per member. \$8.98 goes to the Office of the General Assembly. \$3.25 goes to the Synod of the Covenant. \$25.00 goes to the Maumee Valley Presbytery.

Our congregation is bound to pay \$37.23 per member of our church. Although Per Capita is included as a line item in the budget, you can help offset the costs of Per Capita. Please consider contributing \$37.20. In doing so, you are helping our denomination continue its important ministries.
