


- \$4.1 million dollars was granted by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance in the United States and throughout the world in the first half of 2020.


Faith of a Mockingbird

Cents-Ability

Cents-Ability originated in 1976 as "Two-Cents-A-Meal," a project begun by Presbyterian Women to involve individuals and families in a corporate response to world hunger. Over the years, presbyteries have developed similar programs entitled Pennies for Hunger, Nickel-A-Meal, etc. Many of these programs benefit local hunger ministries as well as the national and international projects of the Presbyterian Hunger Program. (PHP).

Here at FPC Huron, we participate in Cents-Ability on Communion Sundays. Look for the red bucket, and share your cents to help fight hunger. In 2021, our presbytery distributed monies proportionally to help out food banks in our region, including:

- South Michigan Food Bank (in MVP covers Lenawee County)
- Gleaners Community Food Bank of Southeastern Michigan (in MVP covers Monroe County)
- The Toledo Northwestern Ohio Food Bank (covers eight counties (all MVP) Defiance, Fulton, Henry, Lucas, Ottawa, Sandusky, Williams, and Wood)
- The West Ohio Food Bank (covers Paulding, Putnam, Hancock, Seneca, Van Wert, Allen, Hardin, Wyandot, Mercy, Auglaize, and Shelby County)
- Second Harvest Food Bank of North Central Ohio (In MVP, covers Erie Co.) 6
