A Message from Your Pastor

A few months ago, I shared with you that our congregation is joining a cohort with three other Presbyterian churches to explore the theme of church transformation, led by Leighton Ford Ministries. One of the other churches is Norwalk Presbyterian Church, where my husband is the pastor. We will begin this process in earnest this September 17th. I want to share an article about the process, which Rev. James Hodsden wrote. I hope it gives you further insight into the purpose of the process.

FOCUS CAN MAKE ALL THE DIFFERENCE by Rev. James Hodsden

The 2003 book Moneyball by Michael Lewis and the subsequent movie starring Brad Pitt tells how the Oakland Athletics built a successful baseball team on the cheap. How did they do it? They changed their focus. They discovered that a player's ability to get on base predicted how many runs he would score better than more traditional measures. Then, they built a team based on this new outlook. Whether you agree with A's statistical analysis isn't the point. What matters is that our focus can make all the difference.



Churches often have the wrong focus. They enslave themselves to the "Three Bs"-- BUCKS in the bank, BUTTS in the pews, and the BUILDING's square footage. These certainly are important, but defining a church's success by them is a fool's errand. Other measures might tell us more.

- Does our church have a clear sense of God's calling?
- Does the church foster a sense of community?
- Does our church make a difference in our city, region, and world?
- Does our church adapt, applying God's love to new situations?
- Does our church leadership act as good stewards of the blessings we have received?

Starting in September, the First Presbyterian Church of Norwalk (editor's note: and First Presbyterian Church of Huron) partners with Leighton Ford Ministries. Thanks to a grant from the Lily Foundation, this organization will use its experience and wisdom to help our congregation chart a course for the future. (continued on page 2)

WHO'S READY FOR **DESSERT FIRST?**

Deuteronomy 8:10-18 "You shall eat your fill and bless the Lord your God for the good land that he has given you."

Ah, dessert. It's the best part of the meal! Yet, when we go out to eat, we rarely order dessert. Why is that? I know that when I look at the prices of desserts on the menu, I lose my appetite for dessert. I do it if I have enough leftover funds to buy dessert. Otherwise, I see dessert as optional, extravagant, and unnecessary.

How often do we demonstrate these intentions when giving to God? We focus on our needs first and then offer God what is left over. We eat our salad and main course and save the pie for last.

Giving to God first is a lot like eating dessert first. You look at the dessert menu and order off that before ordering the main course. It's not sensible. One author points out that giving first to God "calls us into a life where every decision we make stands in the shadow of our expressed commitment to Jesus." God challenges us to give our first fruits, knowing that all He gives us belongs to Him. He takes care of us extravagantly-and our thanksgiving for that extravagance should overflow.

This fall, we will celebrate Stewardship with the theme "Dessert First." We will hear stories of stewardship from our members, be challenged to give to continue the ministry of our church, and, yes, we will eat a lot of desserts. Join us for our Stewardship kick-off on Sunday, September 24th, with a celebration meal!




Jesus sent the disciples out two by two to proclaim the Gospel, giving them authority over unclean spirits. (Mark 6:7). They had much success. But then, their efforts to help a boy with an evil spirit proved futile until Jesus arrived and stepped in to restore him. "Why could we not cast it out?" they asked. Jesus responded that this needed prayer. (Mark 9-28-29).

Sometimes, we need to be reminded to pray. To imagine that God's power is simply at our disposal and under our control is tantamount to unbelief; it's trusting in ourselves rather than trusting in God. Prayer acknowledges that God must work wonders because we can't. And until we rely on God's grace, we cannot intervene in anyone's circumstances and make an eternal difference. So, we must align our prayers with God's will and pray to the one who has all the power and deserves all the glory. God can do far more than we even dare to ask or imagine. (Eph. 3:20)
