A Message from Pastor Sara

The Associated Press says that seven of ten people are anxious about the election. That's a lot of anxiety!

As we watch political ads, listen to political stump speeches, and observe social media rhetoric on the election, it is no wonder we feel anxious. By Wednesday morning, I suspect many folks may not have any fingernails left!

An evangelical Presbyterian pastor in Michigan used to say, "God doesn't bite his fingernails." In all things and all ways, God is sovereign. There is nothing Christians need to fear because we can trust in a God who is not distant. As Psalm 46 says, "Be still and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations. I will be exalted in the earth. . . The Lord Almighty is with us. The God of Jacob is our refuge." So, keep a proper perspective if the election doesn't turn out as you like. Kingdoms rise, and kingdoms fall, but God goes on and on.

God's people in both the Old and New Testaments would be shocked by our system of governance. In their time, kings and rulers were not chosen by the population but through family lines or political and military conquest. Although God provided Israel with anointed judges and monarchs for 800 years or so (between Judges and I and II Kings), most

of the time, Israel was ruled by those who had Israel as a target of their conquests.

As Americans, we experience governance differently. We are blessed with the ability to express our views at the polling place. Rather than being the subjects of a king or queen, our elected leadership is subject to us. Because we vote, we are the leadership.

Romans 13:1 says, "Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God." In our nation, God has blessed us with this authority. Without the people's consent, one cannot become a President, Congressional Representative, or school board member.

I keep this in mind when I vote. It's a blessing to live where we are not subjects to be ruled over by others but total participants in our governance. Only one authority ultimately reigns over us, and that authority is God.

If you haven't already, I urge you to share the blessing of voting. Once you've voted, put it all in God's hands. Whether your favorite wins or loses, God is still God and always will be.


