
SEPTEMBER 2025

Building Updates



The biggest building update is what Christ's Community meal is installing in our kitchen! As the ministry continues to grow, so does the need for space. A generous donor to CCM has allowed them to purchase and pay for this walk-in refrigerator and freezer. Praise God! This will replace our current refrigerator, and three freezers on our premises.

Over the summer, our carpets were cleaned, and our trees were trimmed to comply with our city's regulations. We also needed to install a new fire system to comply with building codes, and that cost \$25,000. Soon, we will need to repair the steeple, and fix our sidewalks. Donations to our building fund are always welcome.

At its most recent meeting, Session approved a motion from the Growth and Preservation Board to tithe the recent bequest from Parmalee Jones. \$60,000 will go to the Maumee Valley Presbytery for mission. In addition, a motion was approved to send \$15,000 to OhGo to assist with the purchase and equipping of a van used for its mobile food pantry.
