

A Call to Faithful Stewardship: All Creatures Great and Small

As autumn arrives, we begin our annual stewardship season, a time to reflect on our collective commitment to the vital work and ministry of FPC Huron. Each year, we look ahead to the upcoming operating budget, and once again, we invite you, our beloved congregation, to offer your financial support. This year, the Finance Committee has set a giving target of \$180,000.

Our stewardship theme this year is "All Creatures Great and Small." This theme beautifully encapsulates our mission at FPC Huron: "Tending to the hearts and souls of our neighbors." Our congregation deeply values putting faith into action—loving one another and supporting missions that embody God's love throughout the wider world. When we love all creatures, great and small, we witness to Christ through both word and deed.

While stewardship campaigns can sometimes feel solely focused on financial targets, their true purpose lies in something far more profound: Stewardship is about using the resources God provides us for His glory. Faithful stewardship empowers us to continue growing as the people God created us to be. Without your faithful stewardship, it becomes more challenging to fulfill our sacred purpose—tending to the hearts and souls of our neighbors and caring for all of God's creatures, great and small.

As you prayerfully consider your giving for the coming year, we encourage you to challenge yourself to give a set percentage of your income. On the back of your pledge card, you will find a helpful scale suggesting various percentages. If you are already giving a set

percentage, we invite you to prayerfully consider increasing that percentage.

For those who do not currently give a set percentage, we encourage you to consider increasing your pledge by 16%. For example, if you pledged \$2,000 in 2025, consider pledging \$2,320 in 2026, which breaks down to approximately \$26.50 per month.

The Stewardship Committee also recommends a pledge to assist the Presbytery's operating budget by contributing an amount equal to the per capita apportionment. In 2026, we will owe the Presbytery \$40.71 for each member.

We extend our deepest gratitude for your faithfulness and generosity. We recognize that when you give to the church, you are making a faithful sacrifice. Your sacrifices are what make it possible for our congregation to continue its vital work of caring for all creatures, great and small.

Investing in the Kingdom of God: Growth and Preservation Funds

The Session and the Growth and Preservation Committee prayerfully collaborate to manage and distribute funds, blessings generously bestowed upon our church through bequests and memorial gifts. The Growth and Preservation Committee, guided by the Holy Spirit, prayerfully considers unique ways these funds may be spent to fulfill the mission of our congregation, "Tending to the hearts and souls of our neighbors." The monies in the Growth and Preservation fund are to be held as a trust from God.

Our congregation recently received a sizable bequest from the estate of Parmalee Jones. In humble gratitude to God for this divine blessing, the Growth and Preservation Committee and the Session agreed to make a tithe to the Presbytery of Maumee Valley in the amount of \$60,000, honoring God with the first fruits of our abundance.

In other Growth and Preservation Fund spending, the G & P Committee prayerfully recommended, and Session approved a \$4000 request from Helping Hands of Huron Food Pantry, and \$15,000 from OhGo, extending God's love to those in need. We challenged the Erie County Community to match the \$15,000 gift to OhGo for the purpose of buying and equipping a new truck, multiplying the blessings to serve more.

Growth and Preservation welcomes all members and friends of FPC Huron to prayerfully make recommendations for the expenditure of these funds, seeking God's will in every decision.
