A Message from Pastor Sara

As Thanksgiving nears, we naturally feel gratitude for our blessings. Gratitude is vital to the Christian life, but Scripture shows it must lead to action—it must "grow legs."

Paul connects gratitude and action, saying, "whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks..." (Colossians 3:17). Gratitude isn't passive; it shapes our deeds. Recognizing life as a gift makes us want to give in return.

This is why the New Testament links gratitude and generosity. Paul encourages giving because "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7) and our generosity "will produce thanksgiving to God" (2 Corinthians 9:11). Gratitude fuels generosity, which in turn inspires more gratitude—a holy, multiplying cycle. I see this when acts of gratitude in our church ripple outward, inspiring further service.

Jesus said, "Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16). Gratitude lights this lamp, shining God's love through our actions.

Gratitude must be cultivated. In a world focused on lack, we must practice pausing daily to say, "Thank you, Lord." Spiritual maturity comes from learning to give thanks in all circumstances (1 Thessalonians 5:18).

This November, make gratitude a spiritual practice. Keep a journal, listing three daily gratitudes. Ask how that gratitude can

take action. The world needs people whose thankfulness becomes "grace in motion."

Let gratitude move us this November to serve, give, and shine. The best way to thank the Giver of "every good and perfect gift" (James 1:17) is to share those gifts with the world.

May your November be full of giving thanks and of experiencing the joy a giving heart beats.

The Children look forward to Star Leader Day. They get to bring in snacks and share their special toy.




