A Message from Pastor Sara

What do you do to get ready for Christmas? For many of us, the list is long—decorating, shopping, baking, wrapping, cleaning, traveling, gathering. The calendar fills up fast.

In all that activity, even Christians sometimes lose sight of what we're actually celebrating: that God took on flesh, grew in Mary's womb, and entered our world in a messy stable. Even pastors can forget, as the wonder of the Incarnation gets buried under the weight of preparation.

One thing that clears the fog for me is a piece of music many of you know: Handel's Messiah. Not just the "Hallelujah Chorus," but the first section, rooted in Isaiah's promises—especially the movement "For Unto Us a Child Is Born." For a few beautiful minutes, the music presses the truth of Isaiah 9:6 into my heart: "For unto us a child is born... and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

Each title speaks a word we need:

Wonderful Counselor — guiding us with wisdom.

Mighty God — strong enough to carry our burdens.

Everlasting Father — loving us with a steady, enduring love.

Prince of Peace — offering deep peace in a turbulent world.

At Christmas, we remember more than just the birth of a boy in Bethlehem. We celebrate the fulfillment of God's promise: a Savior known by many names, each one reflecting His enduring love and presence. May the comfort, strength, and peace found in those names be yours this season.

REMEMBRANCE TREE

During the Advent season in 2015, FPC Worship Committee began the "Tree of Remembrance" activity and 'Service of Remembrance,' for which a tree is placed in the parlor (below steps leading into sanctuary) each Advent, and ornaments in remembrance of deceased church members, relatives, special friends, special co-workers, etc. are placed on the tree and then saved for the 'Tree of Remembrance' in following years. (The ornament need not represent a death that occurred during the past year.) We encourage anyone who would like to add an ornament/s to bring the ornament and place it on tree at any time, drop off the ornament in Office or Choir Room, OR contact office or Jann (440-452-6115) to make arrangements to place the ornament/s for or with you.

Please write the name of the person "remembered" on the ornament itself, or attach a small tag with the name. Consider an ornament that reminds you of, or is 'characteristic' of the person/s if you so choose. (The tree now holds ornaments as varied as...angels, fishing tackles, footballs, bells, chalk boards, tea cups, birds, sewing materials, clocks, lighthouses and the like!). During the morning Worship Service on December 21st, Pastor Sara will include a brief 'Prayer of Thanksgiving and Remembrance' time.' Each year the ornaments are packed away in a safe spot so they can be returned to the tree the following Advent. (Feel free to contact Jann Glann at the above number if you have questions.)
