## A Message From Pastor Sara

January holds two truths at once.

On the one hand, it feels like a fresh start. New calendars, blank pages, resolutions, hopes for what might be different this time around. On the other hand, January can feel heavy. The decorations are put away, the days are cold and dark, and life looks much the same as it did in December—with its joys and its challenges still firmly in place.

The good news is that God works in both places.

Scripture reminds us that God is always doing a new thing—not only in moments of excitement and energy, but also in quiet persistence, steady faithfulness, and small acts of love that add up over time. As the prophet Isaiah declares,

“I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?” (Isaiah 43:19)

And even more tenderly, we are reminded that God’s mercies meet us again and again, day by day:

“The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases,  
his mercies never come to an end;  
they are new every morning;

great is your faithfulness.” (Lamentations 3:22–23)

Not new every January 1st, but every morning.

As a congregation, we enter this new year with deep gratitude for what has been—and with trust in the God who will walk with us into whatever lies ahead. We don’t need to have everything figured out. We don’t need perfect plans or flawless resolutions. What we need is the willingness to keep showing up: to worship, to pray, to serve, to care for one another, and to tend to the hearts and souls of our neighbors.

May this January be a season not just of new beginnings, but of renewed trust in the God who makes all things new, one faithful step at a time.

Come review 2025, and look ahead to 2026 with us. We will serve brunch immediately after worship, and convene the meeting after brunch.

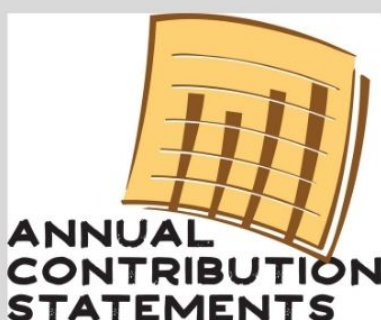

## New Worship Initiative

As part of our strategic initiatives, First Presbyterian Church of Huron is discerning whether God may be calling us to offer a new alternative worship service. This service would not replace our current worship but would provide an additional opportunity for people in our community to gather, pray, and praise God, potentially using jazz and other popular music forms as part of the worship. We are forming a small team to help with prayerful discernment, imagination, and exploration of this possibility. You are invited to join us for an Ash Wednesday worship service on Wednesday, February 18, at 12:00 p.m. This quiet, reflective service will mark the beginning of the season of Lent, a time of prayer, repentance, and renewed trust in God's grace. The service will include the imposition of ashes as a tangible reminder of our mortality and our hope in Christ.



All current and prospective ushers are invited to a brief Usher Training on Sunday, January 25, held immediately following the worship service. This refresher will review the basics of welcoming, assisting, and caring for those who come to worship—helping ensure that our hospitality reflects Christ's love for all.

The training will take no more than 15 minutes, and is a great opportunity both for experienced ushers and for anyone interested in serving in this important ministry. Your presence makes a difference in how people experience worship from the moment they enter our doors.

## Sanctuary Guild

The Sanctuary Guild helps care for the visual and worship elements of our sanctuary, ensuring that the space reflects the seasons of the church year and is ready to welcome all who come to worship. Responsibilities include tending to banners and paraments according to the liturgical calendar, as well as checking pew supplies such as pencils, prayer cards, and envelopes. 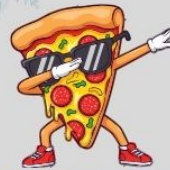




# Little Wonders Preschool
